We are thrilled to announce that the upcoming formal NCHS-organized testing event, a pivotal milestone in our journey, is set for December 2-3, 2024. This event marks an important step in our collective progress, and we encourage all stakeholders to mark this date on their calendars.

An astounding 57 Vital Records Offices (VROs) have participated in an NCHS-organized testing event as either observers or testers, which covers 100% participation, and 23 jurisdictions have already registered for the upcoming testing event. Jurisdictions are now being encouraged to consider becoming testers. If a jurisdiction is not yet ready to test, they may still be able to participate as an observer if we have sessions for them to observe. To that end, we ask for volunteers from testing jurisdictions to share their screens with observing jurisdictions during the testing event. If you are willing to volunteer, please email nvssmodernization@cdc.gov.

In preparation for the event, it is crucial for testing jurisdictional participants to ensure access to the NVSS API (test environment) through SAMS. This is an essential step toward the event's success. If you are not already in the process of getting access (or already have access based on past testing events), please reach out to nvssmodernization@cdc.gov and make the request. The

individuals doing the hands-on testing are the intended recipients for API access.

Every Tuesday from November 12^{th –} 26th, NVSS has dedicated the CoP office hour to test preparation as we gear up for the NCHS-organized testing event in December. For this quarter, we will conduct three prep calls, as well as offer FHIR validation services to all participating jurisdictions. We encourage any jurisdiction starting/completing the FHIR mortality precertification steps 1 and 2 to continue this process during the testing event. DACEB will invite jurisdictions to begin certification after they have validated their precertification data. It is also important to note that jurisdictions that have started precertification during testing events will still need to notify CoP of their start and end dates.

During the testing event, the NVSS CoP will also offer jurisdictions the ability to test the developmental version of the Birth and Fetal Death Reporting (BFDR) .NET library. During this testing event, NCHS aims to provide support for the following goals:

- The ability to create birth reporting messages in FHIR format.
- Basic capability for exchanging natality messages, including sending acknowledgment messages and extracting error notifications.
- Enhanced (additional) natality test case.

CTE also announced recently that new releases have been made to the VRDR .NET, VRDR Java, and Canary libraries. The latest changes target <u>Vital Records Death Reporting (VRDR) IG STU 2.2.0</u>. New releases have also been made to the BFDR .NET including changes that target Birth and Fetal Death Reporting (BFDR) IG STU 2.0 and Vital Records FHIR Messaging (VRFM) IG 2.0.0. It is important to note that the NVSS API (test) has also been updated to use VRDR .NET 4.4. **Please update your libraries in preparation for the December 2024 testing event.**

We want to thank our technical partners, MITRE, Ruvos, NAPHSIS, and CTE, for their continuous collaboration in our modernization efforts. Their valuable contributions have been instrumental in the success of our recurring meetings and organized testing events. We greatly

appreciate their support and look forward to continuing our partnership.

ICD-11 Status Update

Two groups within NCHS (ICD-11 Implementation Workgroup and Automated Coding for ICD-11) are currently meeting to strategize requirements and feasibility of approaches to implement ICD-11 in the United States. Updates will be posted periodically in the NVSS monthly newsletter.



Notable Publications/Data Briefs

Declines in Triplet and Higher-Order Multiples Births in the United States, 1998-2023



This report was published October 31st and can be found at this <u>link</u>. From 1998 to 2023 the triplet and higher-order multiple birth rate declined 62%, from 193.5 to 73.8 births per 100,000 total births; the largest declines were from 2009 to 2023. From 1989 to 2023 the number of triplet and higher-order births declined from 7,625 to 2,653. Declines were observed for White non-Hispanic (71%) and Hispanic mothers (25%) while the rate for Black non-Hispanic mothers increased (25%). Triplet and higher-order birth rates declined for all age groups 20 and older from 1998 to 2023 and the largest declines were for mothers ages 30 and older.
