3. Choose when to consult with, or refer a patient to, an addiction medicine specialist
4. Select levels of care available within addiction medicine treatment
5. Develop an appropriate treatment plan that considers all factors to promote positive patient outcomes
6. Identify strategies that help to establish trust between patient and clinician
7. Identify ways a clinician might communicate with patients in a way that encourages engagement in treatment
8. Describe motivational interviewing techniques to promote positive patient outcomes for substance use treatment
9. Recognize the importance of care coordination and interprofessional collaboration in the treatment of substance use disorders
10. Identify elements of successful care coordination
11. List factors that impact treatment
